Learning Focus

In English, our focus texts are 'Deadly Science – The Solar System' and 'Meanwhile Back on Earth', which will inform our learning in reading, spelling, grammar and handwriting. Our writing this term will focus on informative and imaginative texts. In maths, we will be learning numbers, additive relations, multiplicative relations, fractions, patterns & algebra, 2D & 3D spatial structures, position, angles, data and chance. Students will have the opportunity to learn problem solving skills via the maths games and explorer competitions. Our science unit will focus on how we make food and fibre products from animals and plants. For HSIE, we will be learning about different environments (local and global) and their significance. Our project this term will be a diorama on an environment. For personal development health and physical education, students will investigate whether the rights of others are being respected. In the creative arts, students will continue to develop their skills in visual arts and the performing arts. We will continue our learning journey in STEM.
